Dear unnamed "Risk Manager",

I must first express that the fact that you do not have a name is deeply disturbing. It is rather fascist and inhumane. EWU must be accountable in human-to-human contact. All the policies that EWU suggests, must be allowed to be discussed in an open forum with men and women interacting as men and women, not as men and women interacting with the unnamed "wizard of oz" Risk Manager. As a named member of this community, I expect to be able to contact an actual human being.

I see that you are offering to make the Covid-19 antigen testing mandatory. I would like to counter that offer:

Testing of any kind, be it PCR, or antigen, or biometric is inherently invasive, and is therefore a violation of bodily autonomy, and privacy. Testing will be appropriate, only when the invasive nature, both physically and bodily can be resolved. No one has the right to forcibly collect the genetic or medical information of a person, full stop. Our medical information is private and in the United States is protected under HIPPA laws.

Testing men and women for any disease, either imagined or real, asymptomatic or symptomatic, as a prerequisite to their being able to move freely on the planet, including public lands and institutions is a violation of our constitutional and inalienable right to Liberty. Testing will be appropriate, only when it does not violate or threaten our Liberty. It is therefore out of the jurisdiction of EWU, the state health board, the local, state, and federal governing bodies to undermine this inalienable right to Liberty.

As "Risk Manager", I suggest you consider the risk you pose to the men and women engaged in business with EWU, as well as to the men and women professors and staff, when you suggest we must give up our inalienable rights in order to do business with EWU. A policy such as mandatory testing, suggests that EWU has the right to force the loss of what it is to be a free man or woman. It does not. Only a fascist institution, that has no regard for our inalienable rights, as affirmed by the U.S. Constitution, on which our Republic was founded, would suggest that an invasive biological test would be required for men and women to engage in what, for all of time, was normal, everyday behavior. It is insane, anti-American, anti-human and against the laws of all creation. It will not stand.

The right to privacy and liberty are immutable and inalienable. If EWU is to survive and thrive, it will be because it affirms these Truths and creates policy in support of them.




P.S. I will be posting this letter publicly and all responses or lack of response will become part of the public record. I say this, not as a threat, but to impress upon the man or woman reading this letter that preserving Liberty is of the utmost importance and EWU policy must reflect and respect this universal law as is dictated by the Most High.

On Monday, March 8, I received a response from Trent Lutey, Ph.D., Director of Risk Management at EWU thanking me for my concerns and letting me know that he has forwarded my concerns to the (unnamed) COVID-19 crisis management team. As of Friday, March 12 the COVID-19 crisis management team has not reached out to me addressing my letter. On EWU's website, although testing is now optional for faculty and staff, it remains mandatory for students.



The students have been told they are required to be tested, which implies that they do not have the medical freedom to choose, yet within the form the students have to sign at the testing site, they must sign this statement: "I voluntarily agree to this testing for COVID-19". So which is it? Is it voluntary or is it mandatory? It seems to me that, again EWU is misleading our community, I have in the past been giving our administration the benefit of the doubt, but this blatant contradiction seems intentional!

Dear students, stand up for your rights. You do not have to submit to medical testing, nor do you have to sign anything in order to live a normal life and participate in public life. Just say no. They cannot force this upon anyone. It is out of their jurisdiction. What they are asking is unprecedented. NEVER BEFORE have healthy people been required to submit to a test to freely participate in public life. Allowing this, would normalize tyranny. We must not participate in this because the loss of Liberty that this creates as a precedent is unacceptable. Testing must be voluntary!
